# Statement from the 2018-2020 Chair


Dear Friends,

**Past Case Challenge Partners:** 

During the 2019-2020 school year, Lake Worth High School launched 3DE, an innovative high school model proven to accelerate student engagement and academic outcomes in traditional public high schools. 3DE's multifaceted approach to learning uses case methodology to integrate real-world connectivity into the standard high school experience. This universally effective approach to learning is the anchor for interdisciplinary pedagogy, relevant connectivity, and authentic project-based application that is delivered in every 3DE school. The result is a high school experience that reflects the dynamic pace of activity and interconnectedness of life beyond the classroom walls.

3DE's dedicated teachers set high expectations and foster a strong sense of community among their students. Year-over-year, the curriculum layers in defined competencies to continually build students' skills and mindset as they advance from facilitated learning to self-directed. By the end of their four-year high school career, students graduate with the knowledge, skills and confidence to thrive in post-secondary and beyond.















"I have seen a number of impacts of 3DE at Lake Worth Community High School. The integration of the case challenges and business/entrepreneurship concepts across content areas has been amazing in helping students connect their core class content and skills to points of practical application in the real world, and that connection has helped to deepen and solidify learning across content areas.

In addition, the school-within-a-school model has allowed us to not only more effectively track student performance and collaboratively address areas of academic or social-emotional concern, but it has created a sense of community in the 3DE program that goes deeper than the sense of community all students feel as a part of Lake Worth High School. That sense of 3DE community has enabled our students to feel safe and comfortable, allowing them to learn and grow as individuals at an accelerated rate. For myself and the teachers in 3DE, it has been amazing to see how this model has helped us bring the best out of our students and to intervene effectively when students demonstrate a need for support."

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
